

ACCESSIBILITY

There is an elevator located inside the building with the glass door entrance. Access ramps can be found: inside leading from the lobby to the sanctuary and outside at the rear of the building, leading from the parking lot.

There are accessible washrooms on each floor located near the elevator.

Large print worship bulletins, and hymn books are available from the ushers.

Service animals are welcome, except where food is prepared.

We commit to make R-W a comfortable space for people with cognitive impairment. If you require accommodations please contact the office.

There is a sensory-friendly worship space in the Club Room every Sunday, the service is live streamed into the room with reduced lighting and volume.

BABY/ CHILDREN'S AMENITIES

People can breastfeed anywhere in the building, should you want more privacy there is designated nursing space in the Millson room. Baby changing tables are installed in all washrooms. If you wish to use it, a children's activity centre is set up in the Chapel. There are activity books available. Please ask an usher.



Pastoral Care Costs

This total of this pie chart is \$132,661 which is the Pastoral Care cost.

The slices of the pie represent the areas in which the Pastoral Care cost is spent.

Property \$18,063.25

This is based on the hours of facility usage, used by Pastoral Care and includes the cost of Facility staff time doing Pastoral Care.


Admin \$15,923.10

These is the cost of administrative costs of Pastoral Care, this includes printing, photocopying, materials, postage, etc. and includes the cost of the Office Administrators time doing Pastoral Care.

Minister \$98,674.70

This is the cost of the Ministers time doing Pastoral Care.

All of the staff costs are part of the current wages staff are paid, and these numbers represent the part of the wages allocated to Pastoral Care work done in the year.

This pie chart represents the hours worked by staff and volunteers for Pastoral Care in a year.

Volunteers: 6240 hours
Total: 7976 hours/year

Deficit & Available Funds

The budget for 2024 includes a significant deficit. We have divided the deficit up proportionately to the various groups. This chart represents the expenditure percentages that will be covered by projected 2024 givings, along with what we predict the deficit will be.



Deficit: \$33,165.26 **Available Funds:** \$99,495.79

Sermon: All I ask is for a discerning heart!

We are all called by God to often do things that we do not believe we are capable of. After King David's death, Solomon was fearful that as the new king he was not qualified, that he lacked experience. How many times have we thought to ourselves, "I don't know enough about the Bible or Christianity to take on a leadership role in the community of faith? Solomon asks God for a discerning heart, so that he may serve the world as God intended. God not only grants this request for a discerning heart, but God also grants Solomon wisdom. Who among us has been granted the spiritual gift of wisdom and discernment? As we discern the path of Robertson-Wesley over the next 10 years, where is God's Spirit at work? How have we moved from being a welcoming community of faith to a loving community of faith? What practices do we need to transform in order to live out Jesus' greatest commandment to the fullest?
