
Please know that in the eyes of God you already belong here and you are welcome to participate in any of the activities of the congregation.

ACCESSIBILITY

There is an elevator located inside the building with the glass door entrance. Access ramps can be found: inside leading from the lobby to the sanctuary and outside at the rear of the building, leading from the parking lot.

There are accessible washrooms on each floor located near the elevator.

Service animals are welcome, except where food is prepared.

We commit to make R-W a comfortable space for people with cognitive impairment. If you require accommodations please contact the office.

There is a sensory-friendly worship space in the Club Room every Sunday, the service is live streamed into the room with reduced lighting and volume.

BABY/ CHILDREN'S AMENITIES

People can breastfeed anywhere in the building, should you want more privacy there is designated nursing space in the Millson room, located by the grand piano. Baby changing tables are installed in all washrooms. If you wish to use it, a children's activity centre is set up in the Chapel. There are also activity books available for children. Please ask an usher.

GREEN BITES

The word COMPOST is interesting. The word itself originated in the 14th century when fruits were preserved in the form of a compote. Fruits were cooked together, like a stew, then stored in porcelain containers. When waste products such as food and/or agricultural waste were put together and allowed to deteriorate, the word COMPOTE evolved into COMPOST. The city of Edmonton picks up household compost and heats it with hot water as part of the process in preparation for its use. The heat will kill weeds and insects so that gardeners can be assured they are adding nutritious compost to their soil. happy gardening everyone, and may Compost be with you!! - the Environmental Stewardship Group

EMAIL SAFETY TIPS

Recently people from the church have been experiencing scam emails, using a method called spoofing. Email spoofing is when a scammer forges (spoofs) the email's from address, so the sent message appears to have been sent from someone you know with the intention of infecting your computer with malware, asking for money or stealing information. These addresses can either be created by using alternative numbers or letters to look slightly different than the original, or by disguising the 'from' field to

be the exact email address of someone in your network. If you receive an email that looks like it is from someone you know, requesting gift cards or help and asking for secrecy, please feel free to call Elyse in the church office or the person who sent it to confirm legitimacy, do not reply to the email because the reply will get sent to the scammer.

What to do if your email has been spoofed:

- Don't panic, spoofing does not mean that the scammer has access
 to your account, they are only making it appear as though they do.
 You have not been hacked. Spoofing is a temporary issue that will
 often be resolved in a few weeks when the scammer will move on.
- Email everyone in your contacts to let them know to disregard any suspicious emails from you.
- Just to be safe, run a full virus scan on your computer. This ensures
 that you have not experienced a malware or virus infection and
 helps eliminate the possibility that you have a compromised
 account.
- Update your email password, making sure that you have a robust and secure password.
