
Please know that in the eyes of God you already belong here and you are welcome to participate in any of the activities of the community of faith.

ACCESSIBILITY

There is an elevator located inside the building with the glass door entrance. Access ramps can be found: inside leading from the lobby to the sanctuary and outside at the rear of the building, leading from the parking lot.

There are accessible washrooms on each floor located near the elevator.

We commit to make R-W a comfortable space for people with cognitive impairment. If you require accommodations please contact the office.

There is a sensory-friendly worship space in the Club Room every Sunday, the service is live streamed into the room with reduced lighting and volume.

People can breastfeed anywhere in the building, should you want more privacy there is designated nursing space in the Millson room, located by the grand piano. Baby changing tables are installed in all washrooms. If you wish to use it, a children's activity centre is set up in the Chapel. There are also activity books available for children. Please ask an usher.

GREEN BITES

For the past two weeks, many Canadians have been following the news of water restrictions in Calgary. Some of us have wondered about the availability of clean water in Canada and whether or not other municipalities have had restrictions too. We have heard about the lack of clean water on several First Nations reserves, and wondered about other restrictions throughout our history. When the newly formed North West Mounted Police began their cross-Canada trek using horses and wagons, in 1774, clean water was seldom available. Most water was filthy because of mud and buffalo dung in rivers and streams. In fact many of the men would pour water through their woolen socks in order to have cleaner water for their tea when they set up camp each night. Nearly seventy-five years later, in the early months of World War II, a relative who was a young recruit in rural Nova Scotia, did what many recruits did; he saved some of his tea from the evening meal and used it to brush his teeth that night, and to shave his face the next morning!! - The Environmental Stewardship Group

EMAIL SAFETY TIPS

Recently people from the church have been experiencing scam emails, using a method called spoofing. Email spoofing is when a scammer forges (spoofs) the email's from address, so the sent message appears to have been sent from someone you know with the intention of infecting your computer with malware, asking for money or stealing information. These addresses can

either be created by using alternative numbers or letters to look slightly different than the original, or by disguising the 'from' field to be the exact email address of someone in your network. If you receive an email that looks like it is from someone you know, requesting gift cards or help and asking for secrecy, please feel free to call Elyse in the church office or the person who sent it to confirm legitimacy, do not reply to the email because the reply will get sent to the scammer.

What to do if your email has been spoofed:

- Don't panic, spoofing does not mean that the scammer has access to your account, they are only making it appear as though they do. You have not been hacked. Spoofing is a temporary issue that will often be resolved in a few weeks when the scammer will move on.
- Email everyone in your contacts to let them know to disregard any suspicious emails from you.
- Just to be safe, run a full virus scan on your computer. This ensures that
 you have not experienced a malware or virus infection and helps eliminate
 the possibility that you have a compromised account.
- Update your email password, making sure that you have a robust and secure password.

Worship Notes

The word "Mission" comes with a lot of baggage and hurt. Missionaries were known for swooping into communities because they believed that the people needed faith and needed Jesus in their lives. This came at the expense of the people's culture and traditions, which caused much hurt. In the work that The United Church of Canada is doing with Truth and Reconciliation, some of the Indigenous elders have asked the church to stop using the word *mission*. They have suggested that we instead speak about our *call and commitment* from God. Mission has often been used interchangeably with the word outreach. The point of outreach is to live our faith in the world serving and loving all people. How are we called by God to serve and love others in this neighbourhood? This is what the Board is working on presently.
