If you wish to use it, a children's activity centre is set up in the Chapel. There are activity books available. Please ask an usher.


Coming into God's Presence & Blessing:

# God's Holy Word

James 2:1-17 • Rich in Faith


My dear siblings, do you with your acts of favouritism really believe in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ? For if a person with gold rings and in fine clothes comes into your assembly, and if a poor person in dirty clothes also comes in, and if you take notice of the one wearing the fine clothes and say, "Have a seat here, please," while to the one who is poor you say, "Stand there," or, "Sit at my feet," have you not made distinctions among yourselves, and become judges with evil thoughts? Listen my beloved siblings, has not God chosen the poor in the world to be rich in faith and to be heirs of the kin-dom that God has promised to those who love God? But you have dishonoured the poor. Is it not the rich who oppress you? Is it not they who drag you into court? Is it not they who blaspheme the excellent name that was invoked over you? You do well if you really fulfill the royal law according to the scripture, "You shall love your neighbour as yourself." But if you show partiality, you commit sin and are convicted by the law as transgressors. For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become accountable for all of it. (For the one who said "You shall not commit adultery," also said, "You shall not murder." Now if you do not commit adultery but if you murder, you have become a transgressor of the law. So speak and so act as those who are to be judged by the law of liberty. For judgement will be without mercy to anyone who has shown no mercy; mercy triumphs over judgement.) What good is it, my siblings, if you say you have faith but do not have works? Can faith save you? If a sibling is naked and lacks daily food, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill," and yet you do not supply their bodily

needs, what is the good of that? So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead.


Mark 7:24-37 • A Syrophoenician Woman's Faith.

From there Jesus set out and went away to the region of Tyre. Jesus entered a house and did not want anyone to know he was there. Yet he could not escape notice, but a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit immediately heard about him, and she came and bowed down at his feet. Now the woman was a Gentile, of Syrophoenician origin. She begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter. Jesus said to her, "Let the children be fed first, for it is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs." But she answered him, "Sir, even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs." Then Jesus said to her, "For saying that, you may go - the demon has left your daughter." So she went home, found the child lying on the bed, and the demon was gone. Then Jesus returned from the region of Tyre, and went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis. They brought to him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they begged Jesus to lay his hand on him. Jesus took him aside in private, away from the crowd, and put his fingers into his ears, and he spat and touched his tongue. Then looking up to heaven he sighed and said to him, "Ephphatha," That is, "Be opened." And immediately his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly. Then Jesus ordered them to tell no one; but the more he ordered the, the more zealously they proclaimed it. They were astounded beyond measure, saying, "He has done everything well; he even makes the deaf to hear and the mute to speak.

### Sacrament of Communion and A Gratitude Moment

**Children and Youth:** Children begin in the sanctuary, then go to Kids' Church. Youth meet in the youth room at the beginning of the service. **Scripture:** James 3:13-4:3 • Wisdom from above is gentle and peaceable.

Mark 9:30-37 • Whoever welcomes a child, welcomes me.

Sermon: Curbing cravings; yielding wisdom and good fruit.

Curbing our human cravings for power, recognition and status is an everyday challenge for most of us. Our survival instinct is an important part of being human but at times it does not serve us well. "God made humans to live and move and have their being in God.... God transforms, and calls us to protect the vulnerable, to pray for deliverance from evil, to work with God for the healing of the world, that all might have abundant life." What is our purpose as people of faith? God wants us to love, to be kind and to be equitable, to share in the abundance of all that we have received. # Worship Notes

We welcome the Choir of Robertson-Wesley back after summer break! We have missed you and look forward once again to your inspiring music and worship leadership. The choir's anthem today is based upon the words of one of the best-known and loved psalms (Psalm 84):

"How lovely is your dwelling place, O LORD of hosts!

My soul longs, indeed it faints
for the courts of the LORD;
my heart and my flesh sing for joy
to the living God.

Even the sparrow finds a home,
and the swallow a nest for herself,
where she may lay her young,
at your altars, O LORD of hosts,
my King and my God.

Happy are those who live in your house, ever singing your praise"...

John Stanley (1713-1786) was a blind organist and composer who spent his creative life in London. His *Voluntary in G* is in the typical English baroque form consisting of two movements- the first one slow, and the second one fast. These compositions are for "manuals only" because the English instruments of the time did not have pedalboards. Today's postlude is a dramatic setting of the hymn tune known as "McKee" arranged by American organist and composer Matthew Corl. "McKee" is a melody from the American south that is used in today's hymn "In Christ There Is No East or West".
