There is a sensory-friendly worship space in the Club Room every Sunday, the service is live streamed into the room with reduced lighting and volume.

People can breastfeed anywhere in the building, should you want more privacy there is designated nursing space in the Millson room. Baby changing tables are installed in all washrooms. If you wish to use it, a children's activity centre is set up in the Chapel. There are activity books available. Please ask an usher.



Job 23:1-9, 16-17 • Job's reply.


Then Job answered: "Today also my complaint is bitter; my hand is heavy despite my groaning. Oh, that I knew where I might find God, that I might even come to God's dwelling! I would lay my case before God, and fill my mouth with arguments. I would learn what God would answer me, and understand what God would say to me. Would God contend with me in the greatness of God's power? No; but God would give heed to me. There an upright person could reason with God, and I should be acquitted forever by my judge. "If I go forward, God is not there; or backward, I cannot perceive God; on the left God hides, and I cannot behold God; I turn to the right, but I cannot see God. God has made my heart faint; the Almighty has terrified me; If only I could vanish in darkness, and thick darkness would cover my face!

Matthew 6:25-33 • Do not worry about what you will eat or drink.

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly God feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will God not much more clothe you - you of little faith? Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear?' For it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things; and indeed your heavenly God knows that you need all these things. But strive first for the kin-dom of God and God's righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

**Sermon:** Servant Leadership

What would you do if God suddenly answered you directly or suddenly appeared to you? Job's appeal to God, and his questions about why this is happening to him, are no different than our own questions to God. Why? Often in these situations the question is more important than the answer, for the question is often a lament and a cry of pain. The scriptures invite us to explore what we believe about God and God's power in the world as well as who Jesus is and what servant leadership looks like. How do we respond to suffering, oppression, and human frailty? What can we learn from Jesus' example of self-sacrifice and servant leadership?

Now that this year's garden harvest is ending perhaps we can try our skills
at seed-saving. There are lots of reasons to save seeds, one of which is our
connection to our ancestors. Whether the seeds saved are to pass on beauty,
as in flowers, or food, as in vegetables, we can imagine our grandparents
enjoying the gifts of seeds as we do now. Seed saving is a often a radical
act nowadays, and some people have been taken to court, as it is
considered illegal to save seeds from plants developed and packaged

## **EMAIL SAFETY TIPS**

Recently people from the church have been experiencing scam emails, using a method called spoofing. Email spoofing is when a scammer forges (spoofs) the email's from address, so the sent message appears to have been sent from someone you know with the intention of infecting your computer with malware, asking for money or stealing information. These addresses can either be created by using alternative numbers or letters to look slightly different than the original, or by disguising the 'from' field to be the exact email address of someone in your network. If you receive an email that looks like it is from someone you know, requesting gift cards or help and asking for secrecy, please feel free to call Elyse in the church office or the person who sent it to confirm legitimacy, do not reply to the email because the reply will get sent to the scammer.

What to do if your email has been spoofed:

- Don't panic, spoofing does not mean that the scammer has access
  to your account, they are only making it appear as though they do.
  You have not been hacked. Spoofing is a temporary issue that will
  often be resolved in a few weeks when the scammer will move on.
- Email everyone in your contacts to let them know to disregard any suspicious emails from you.
- Just to be safe, run a full virus scan on your computer. This ensures
  that you have not experienced a malware or virus infection and
  helps eliminate the possibility that you have a compromised
  account.
- Update your email password.

We are in the season of creation which lasts for 5 Sundays beginning the Sunday after Labour Day and continuing through Thanksgiving Sunday. This is the season where we create, and honour that which has been created. This season is symbolized by the colour orange. Orange is a warm colour and is associated with enthusiasm, creativity, fruitfulness, endurance and strength.

We welcome R-W Ringers back to our service today after summer break! The ensemble is ringing today in one larger, and two smaller groups as the music requires. Their Prelude today is a medley of three well-loved Thanksgiving hymns: Now Thank We All Our God, We Gather Together, and For the Beauty of the Earth. Thank you Ringers, it is a blessing to have you back at worship again. The Meditation today (Autumn Carol) is an alternate title for the well-known Thanksgiving hymn, Sing To the Lord of Harvest.
